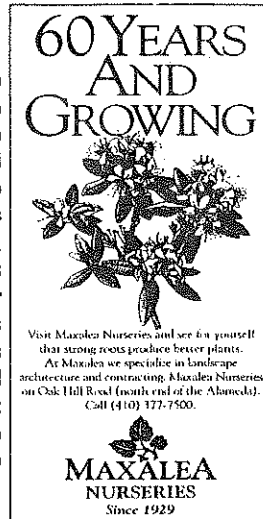

...Goings

Now that my term has ended as your President, I would like to take this opportunity to say that serving THS Alumni, students, faculty and the community has been a gift, and for that, I am grateful. The most important achievement in my term was turning the organization into a revenue generating enterprise whose top priority is supporting scholarship. I am thrilled to report that in each of the last 2 years, we were able to cut our costs by 10% per year while increasing our revenues by 35% in 1998 and 64% in 1999. We can now begin to use interest created by our current funds to offer our largest scholarship: a \$1000 award to the winner of the Ted Prince Memorial Scholarship. Moreover, we hope to increase this at a minimum of 10% per year for the foreseeable future.

These are trends that will continue as I am confident of our new administration. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Executive Board and immediate past officers for their hard work in charting this new course. More importantly, I would like to thank our dues paying members and all those who support our current events and who helped make our inaugural golf tournament such a success. I would also like to offer special thanks to the community for pulling together to make our Meyerhoff Gala a \$12,000 profitable event. Finally, I would like to thank our students and faculty who continue to inspire us to ensure Towson High School builds it's Tradition of

Towson - A Little Update of an Ever Changing Community

If you haven't been to visit lately, you will find many changes in Towson and a few familiar sites. Gone are Finkelstein's (closed), Towson Bootery (moved to Kenilworth Mall) and Hutzler's (closed). Still thriving are Souris' Saloon (new management), The Crease, The Kent Lounge, Towson Deli and Parker's Meats (also new manage). Hooligan's Restaurant has gone from Shaeffer's to American Cafe to Saquaro's to empty...while Towson Stationers and Sunny Surplus remain open. But the most striking change is the opening of the great Towson Roundabout...that's right they have removed the multiple lights at the intersections of Allegheny Avenue, Dulaney Valley, York and Joppa Roads and replaced them with an oval roundabout. While it has taken some time to get

accustomed to, it has reduced back-ups. Other new additions are the long awaited renovation of Hutzler's which now houses Public Storage, Pier 1, Home Elements and Barnes & Noble. More plans are expected. Another shopping mall - Towson Commons (across from Finkelstein's) has seen several restaurants come and go but has a successful 8 screen theater, Border's Bookstore and Paolo's restaurant. So what happened to the Towson Movie Theater?...it closed and now is open as a popular pool hall and small concert venue...plans are to continue to grow from their present size. And finally, our long-time neighbor, State Normal School at Towson has grown to Towson University...with much help from our alumni...

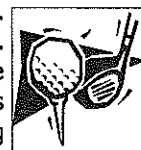

4th of July Parade

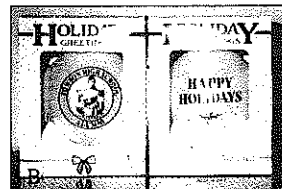
